The Project: Parcel 1: acquisition of 2025 Park Street – 58/60/5-9
Parcel 2: acquisition of 2035 Park Street – 58/60/1-4
```

The project consists of approximately 18, 500 sq.ft. of land used for the Village to expand adjacent recreational facilities that currently contain tennis courts, pickle ball courts and basketball court.

## PUBLIC HEARING (CONTINUED)

Parcel 1: vacant structure on parcel will be altered and used as a recreational facility and community center, with lifeguard beach operations.

Parcel 2: will be used as a community park with open space, seating and landscaping

Parcel 1 & 2 are next to village-owned recreational facilities and not currently being used. Parcel 1 has a vacant structure and Parcel 2 is a vacant lot.

The effect of the proposed project on the environment and residents was considered by the Village. The project will not result in a significant adverse impact on the environment or the residents of the Village. The Village has adopted a negative declaration pursuant to SEQRA.
